

UNODC supports the HIV/ AIDS awareness in Indonesia

1 December 2011
– Commemorating the World AIDS Day, National AIDS Commission, Democrat Party and UNODC jointly conducted HIV

advocacy activity in the House of Representative of the Republic of Indonesia with theme "Understanding HIV from multi-perspectives". This one day campaign was inaugurated by Mr. Marzuki Ali, Speaker of the House, and also included a two hours talk show.

Key resource persons at the talk-show were - PLHIV Representative who shared the experience in accessing prevention, treatment, and care services in Indonesia, Dr. Nafsiah Mboi, Secretary of the National AIDS Commission who presented the National AIDS Strategy and Action Plan 2010-2014, Deputy of Minister of Labor and Transmigration talked on AIDS policy in work place and the Member of Parliament gave presentation on the role of parliamentarians in supporting the HIV/AIDS programme in Indonesia. The event was followed by an exhibition in which over 20 organizations including UNODC participated.

Government of Indonesia sensitizes the United Nations Convention against Corruption

7 to 8 December 2011 – Ministry of Administrative Reform and Bureaucratic Reforms held a national coordination

meeting on the implementation of Presidential Instruction No. 5/2004 on Accelerating the Eradication of Corruption. The objective of this meeting was to increase the commitment and efforts to combat corruption by all government agencies.

In this two-day event, UNODC's nominee Mr. Sujarnako, KPK Director, explained the salient features of United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC) and the UNCAC Review of Indonesia. 1300 government representatives from 33 provinces and relevant ministries attended this meeting. This activity is part of the Royal Government of Norway funded project; 'Strengthening the Capacity of Anti-Corruption Institutions in Indonesia'.

Financial investigation and forensic accounting for the Indonesian law enforcement


Jakarta (Indonesia), 12 to 16 December 2011 and 19 to 23 December 2011
– As part of the European Union funded project; "Support to the Fight Against Corruption", UNODC organised two batches

of training on "Financial investigations and forensic accounting" which aims to enhance the existing capacity of the Indonesian anti-corruption institutions and law enforcement agencies to investigate corruption cases effectively by tracing the financial flows.

The training programme also provided an overview of the existing laws and practices in Indonesia and emphasized the importance of inter-agency coordination among key agencies in conducting financial investigations in corruption cases. An interactive case scenario was showcased to test the knowledge of the participants and explore in a collegiate manner responses and strategies to the problems faced while conducting financial investigation and forensic accounting. 76 participants representing KPK, State Audit Board, Indonesian Financial Transaction Reports and Analysis Centre, Indonesian National Police, Attorney General's Office and Anti-Corruption Court were trained in the two training programmes .

Ministries and Agencies to work with civil society on the Action Plan for Prevention and Eradication of Corruption

13 to 14 December 2011 – Transparency International Indonesia and UNODC held a two-day workshop to formulate a

methodology for monitoring and evaluating the implementation of Presidential Instruction No. 9 /2011 relating to the Action Plan for Prevention and Eradication of Corruption for the year 2011 with a view to enable the civil society to assess the extent of achievement by the Government.

Mr. Kuntoro Mangkusubroto, Chair of the Presidential Working Unit for Supervision and Control of Development, presented in detail the Presidential Instruction No. 9 / 2011. Consequently, participants agreed to monitor the implementation of the upcoming National Action Plan for 2012 in the Attorney General's Office, Indonesian National Police, Ministry of Finance, Indonesia Investment Coordinating Board, Ministry of Administrative Reform and Bureaucratic Reform, Ministry of Law and Human Rights and Ministry of Home Affairs. The event was attended by 50 civil society representatives from Jakarta, Semarang, Yogyakarta, Padang, Makassar, Papua and East Nusa Tenggara. Workshop was funded by the European Union and the Royal Government of Norway.

International Anti-Corruption Day: Honesty is the first step to eradicate corruption


Indonesia, 9 to 20 December 2011 – On the occasion of the 2011 International Anti-Corruption Day, Government of Indonesia and civil societies held a joint anti-corruption campaign which aims to rekindle the spirit of honesty as the first step to

eradicate corruption; "Berani Jujur, Hebat" ("It's Great to be Honest!"). A series of activities were held which included Anti-Corruption Cultural Gathering in Jakarta, SPEAKFEST (Youth against Corruption Festival) in Jakarta, Anti-Corruption Musical Campaign in Padang, Roadshow 7 cities - Bandung, Cirebon, Batang, Brebes, Semarang, Solo, Jogjakarta and Song of Honesty in Jogjakarta.

This National Campaign which is a joint initiative by The Office of the Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia, National Development and Planning Board, KPK, Indonesian National Police, Attorney General's Office, Indonesian Financial Transaction Reports and Analysis Centre, State Audit Board, Judicial Commission, Ombudsman, Ministry of Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform, Ministry of Law and Human Rights, Public Information Commission, Indonesian Corruption Watch, Transparency International Indonesia , CSO partners and UNODC is fully supported by the European Union and the Royal Government of Norway.

Experts meet for the betterment of law enforcement on mutual legal assistance and extradition

15 to 16 December 2011 – UNODC held two-day expert meeting on "Mutual Legal Assistance and Extradition" as part of the European

Union funded transnational crime and criminal justice project. This objective of the expert meeting was to identify and address the problems prevailing in the institutions dealing with mutual legal assistance (MLA) and extradition, especially on the law enforcement and central authority competence and also to establish the networking and strengthen the cooperation among law enforcement in combating the transnational organized crime. The recommendations formulated at the expert meeting will be submitted to Ministry of Law and Human Rights.

Mr. Denny Indrayana, Deputy Minister of Law and Human Rights, was present as keynote speaker. The workshop was attended by 22 experts from the Ministry of Law and Human Rights, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Indonesian National Police, Attorney General's Office, KPK and various Universities.
